# **DARS' Graduate Certificate Programs Disclaimer**

DARS' graduate certificate programs are educational programs. Upon completion of a certificate program, students receive a certificate which is a document that attests to the fact that a student has completed an educational specialty program of study at an institution of higher education. While the completion of a certificate program can lead to professional credentials (e.g., Certificated Substance Abuse Counselor, Certified Rehabilitation Counselor), completion of a certificate program in itself does not constitute having a professional credential. In other words, for example, completing DARS' certificate program in substance abuse counseling does not make one a Certified Substance Abuse Counselor. Professional certifications and licenses are governed by boards empowered via State laws and/or professional organizations and commissions. Making the claim of having a professional credential based on completing one of our certificate programs would be unethical and illegal. Below is a model for listing certificate programs versus professional credentials on a resume/vita.
