## Developing a Workforce More Skilled at Helping those with Co-Occurring Disorders

Individuals with co-occurring disorders (COD) are often ill-prepared to find and utilize appropriate services. Also, many professionals are not certified to provide the necessary prevention, intervention, and treatment plans for clients with COD (Darcy, Dalphonse, & Winsor, 2010). The Substance Abuse Counseling Certificate Program has integrated mental health, COD, substance abuse, and behavioral addictions in their coursework to better assist future graduates to work with clients who have COD.
